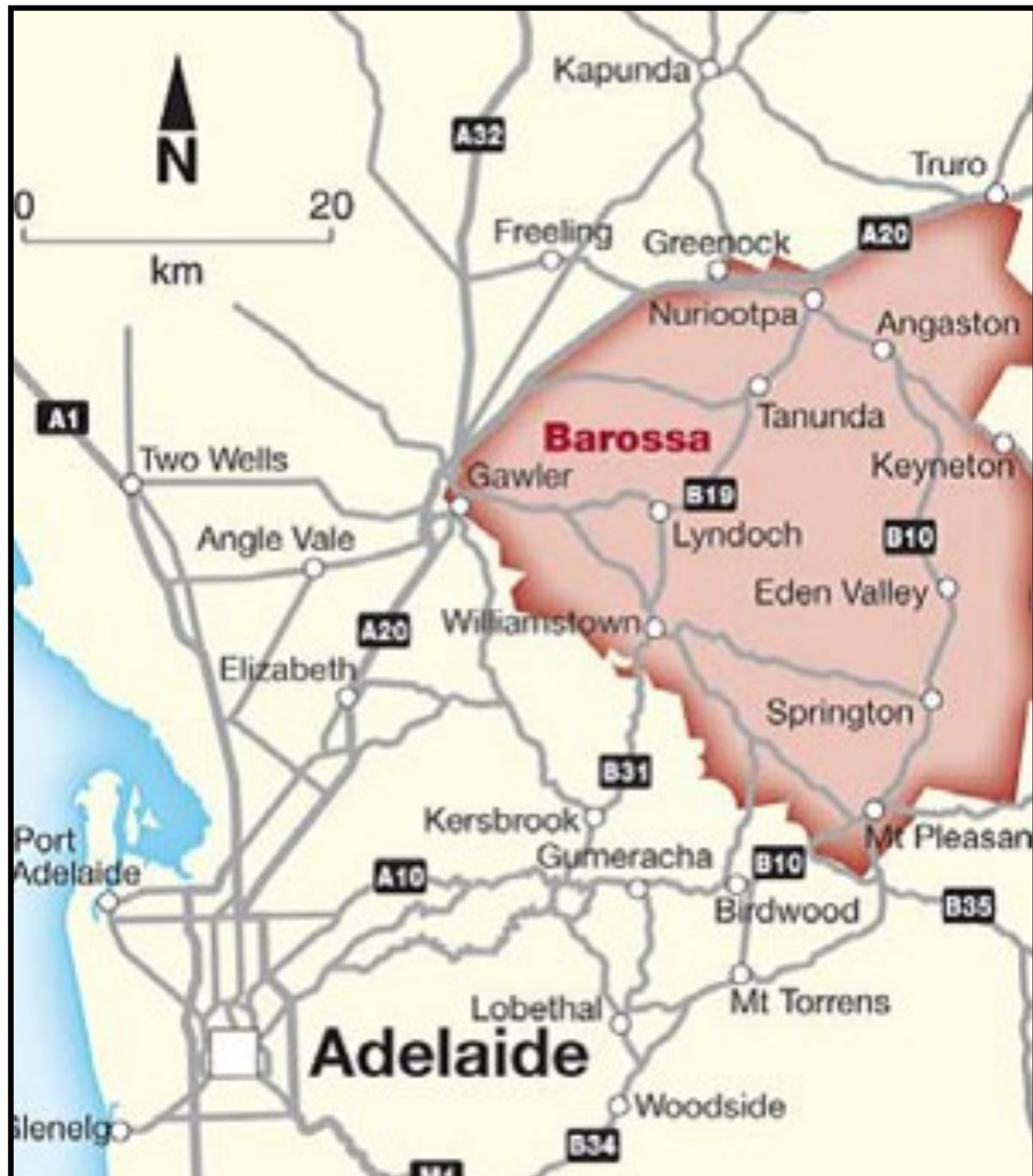

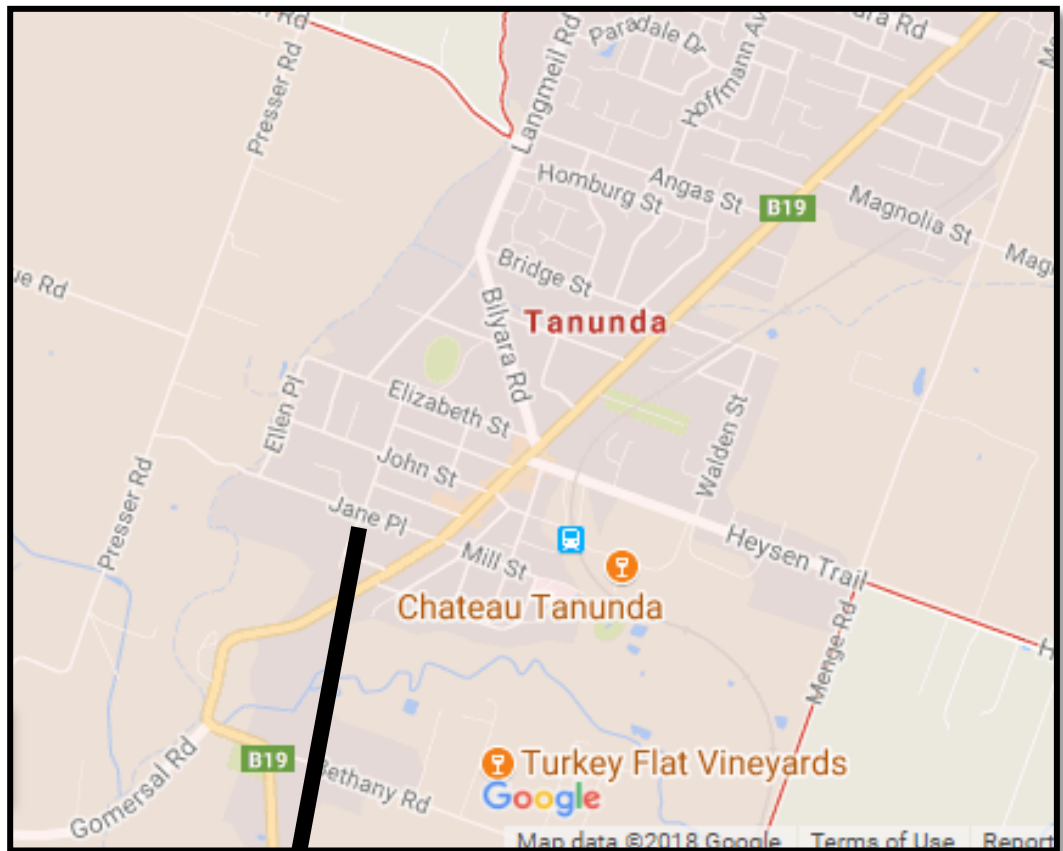

10 Jane Place (north-west of town)

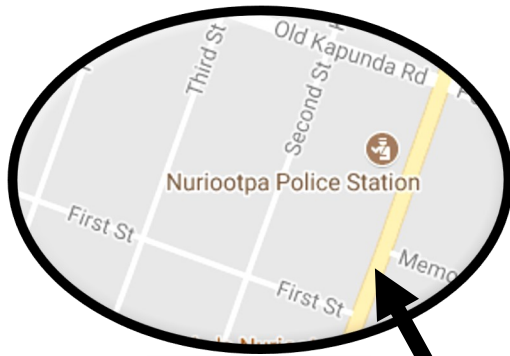

Daughter HEDWIG married Dr Mac Lohe.

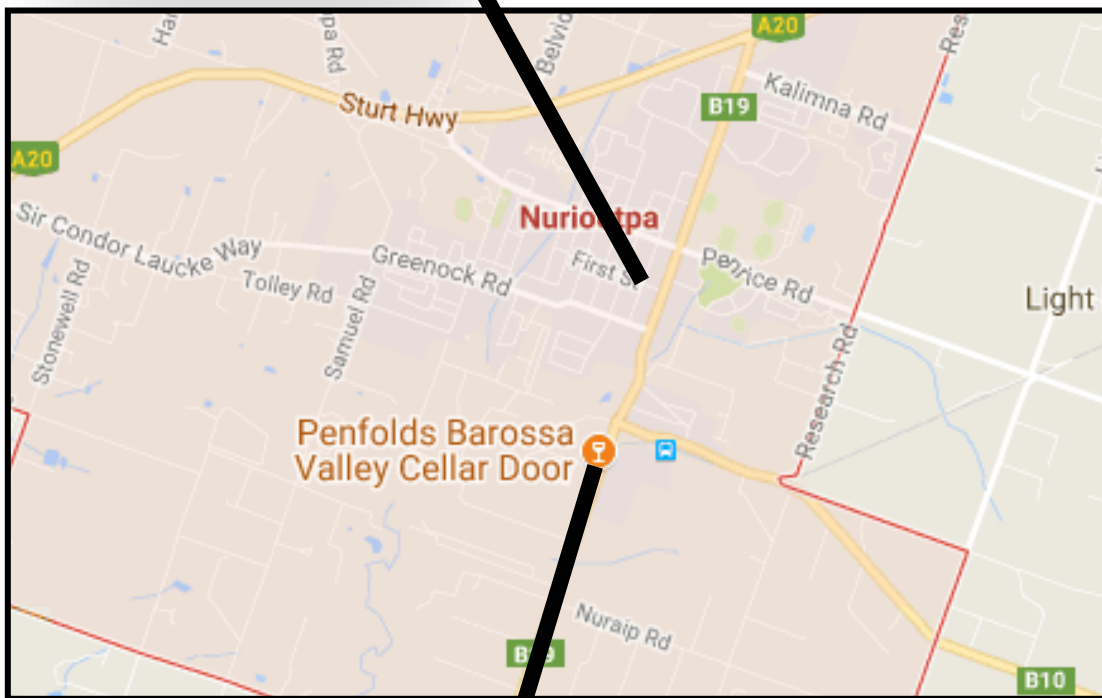
Unmarried daughter IRMGRAD spent her entire life in Tanunda

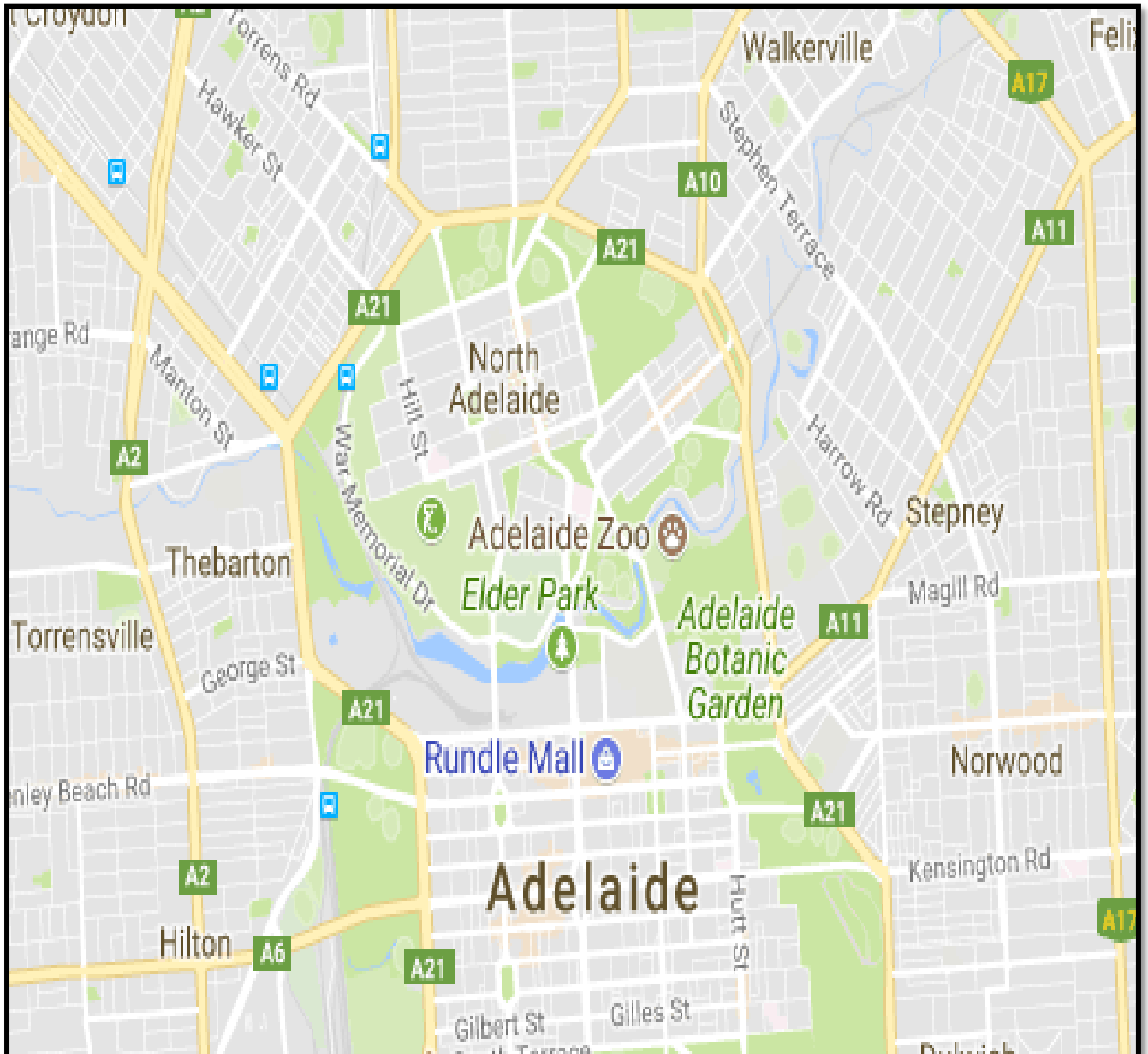
SCHAEDEL'S HOUSE is between Murray St (Main Street also called Barossa Valley Highway) on the right when in Tanunda Direction, between First Street and the Old Kapunda Road. CFW SCHAEDEL married SARAH MARIE PAULINE RECHNER, Sister to GJ RECHNER



PENFOLDS WINES—through Murray Street to Barossa Valley Highway towards Tanunda on the right hand side. Used to have RECHNER woodcarvings on large wine barrels. These have since been sold and at this stage no one knows their location.

PLACES OF INTEREST TO SEE IN ADELAIDE and SUBURBS

SA MUSEUM

Located on North Terrace, east of the Governor's Residence.

In the Museum is a small display of PHOTOGRAPHS and BOOKS relating to Missionary JG Reuther and his work at Lake Kilalpaninna (Bethesda).

His collection of Aboriginal Artifacts (Toas) and his 10 volume description of them is currently held in storage (not on display).

Outside of the Museum on the side nearest the Art Gallery is a PETRIFIED TREE—also a part of JG Reuther's collection. There is no signage here because of cultural sensitivities. This tree had spiritual significance for the Dieri Aborigines.

MIGRATION MUSEUM

Location: From North Terrace turn into Kintore Avenue at the Soldiers Memorial. Follow Kintore Avenue until you reach Kintore Lane which is signed. Take this Lane until you reach a bricked courtyard.

Many of the bricks have names inscribed on them of early South Australia settlers.

Look for two bricks with the names of GJ RECHNER and JG REUTHER on them. They are close in proximity.

39 HILL STREET, NORTH ADELAIDE

This was the former home of Dr Max Lohe and his wife HEDWIG ADELFEID LOHE nee RECHNER, daughter of Friedrich and Meta Rechner. Dr Lohe was a President General of the former United Evangelical Lutheran Church of Australia and the first President of the newly formed Lutheran Church of Australia in 1966.

197 ARCHER STREET, NORTH ADELAIDE

The current National Office of the Lutheran Church of Australia.

Entry from West Terrace just before Anzac Highway—see map on the next page

In this cemetery there is a FISCHER family plot spanning two sites and identified on the map with a red dot. From the Entrance, take the road that veers left to Road 4. Follow Road 4 to Row 29. The Fischer plot is to the left a about the middle of the row.

Both were cremated and the service held at this cemetery.

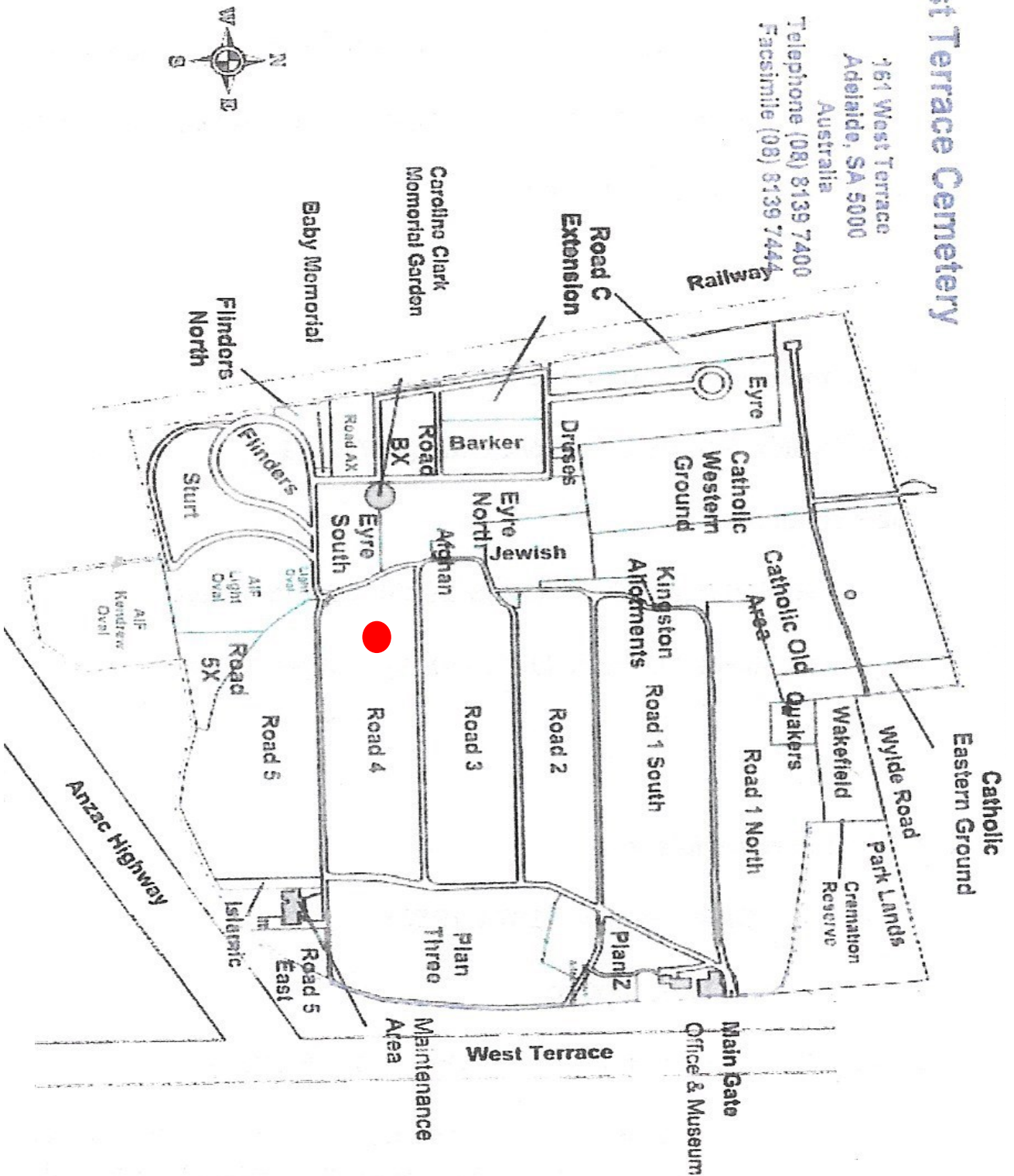
There is no record of what happened to their ashes.

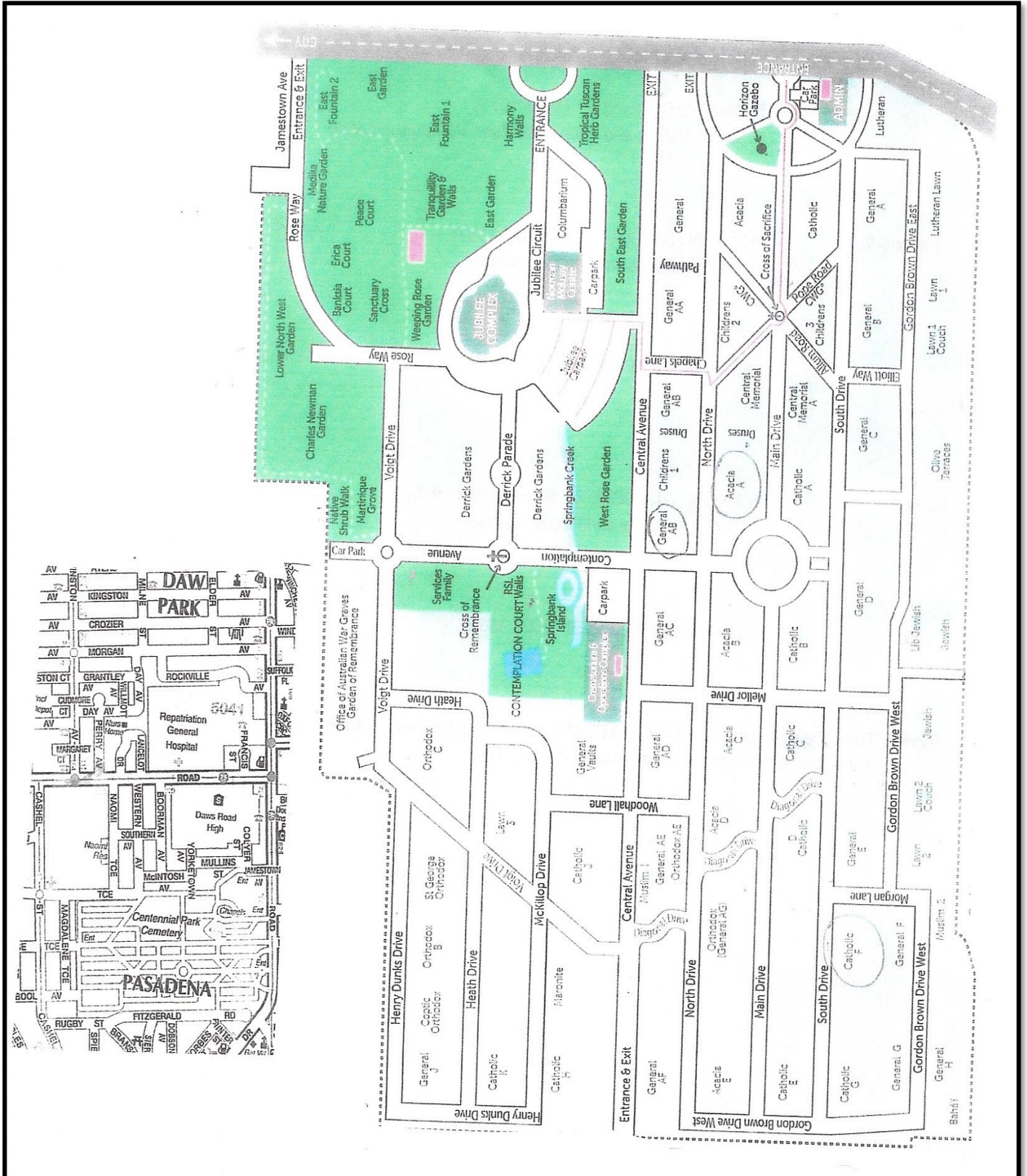

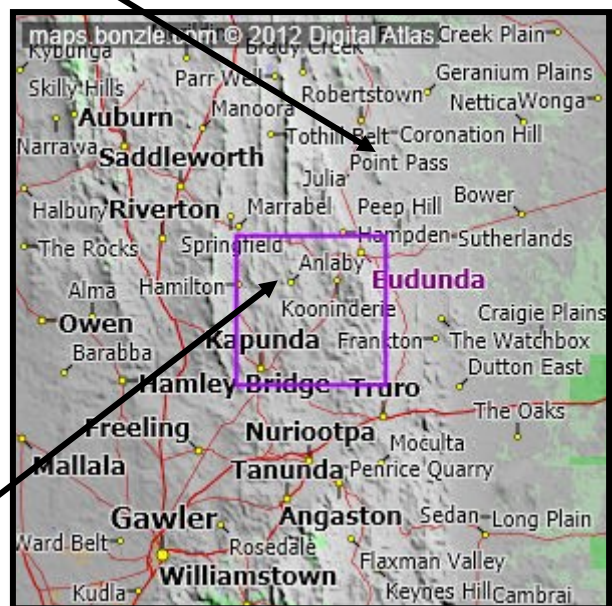

On the 14th January 1849, Julius Rechner joined the Langmeil Lutheran Congregation in Tanunda.
He first tried farming and then worked for a printer in Tanunda.

<p>12</p>	<p>Commencing in June 1850 GJ Rechner accepted the position of teacher at the Immanuel Lutheran Primary School at Light Pass. There were then 48 students.</p> <p>He was also responsible for the congregation's total music program and served as cantor.</p> <p>Married to Bertha on 23rd October 1850.</p> <p>Resigned as teacher in mid 1860.</p> <p>Then worked as Secretary to Georg Fife Angas.</p> <p>1860-1861 he became the first Pastor of the then newly formed Strait</p>
<p>11</p>	<p>The former school building was demolished and replaced with the Kavel Hall.</p>
<p>2</p>	<p>Site of original Strait Gate Lutheran Church built in 1861 shortly after GJ Rechner was ordained and installed.</p> <p>For two years Julius conducted school in the Church.</p>
<p>4</p>	<p>1865 a school building was erected.</p> <p>1917 the old school building was demolished and a new school erected.</p> <p>This school closed in 1983 and transferred to Redeemer Lutheran School in Nuriootpa.</p> <p>The building has since been used for catering purposes.</p>

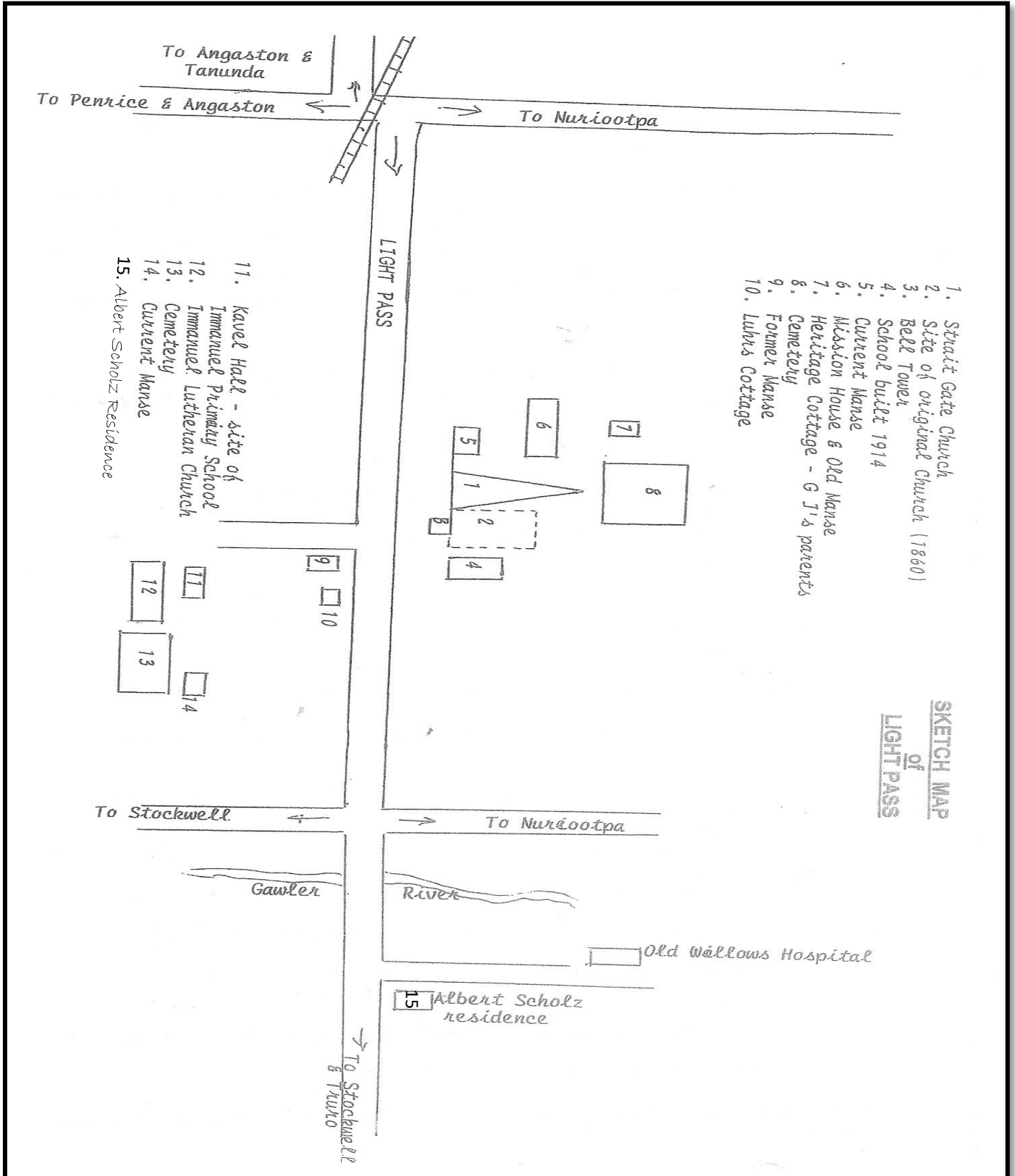

1	In 1961 the new Strait Gate Lutheran Church was built and dedicated.
3	The Bell Tower which was added to the original Church was retained and incorporated into the design of the new Church.
6	The Mission House. Immediately west of this house is the site of the house GJ Rechner built for himself on the land which he had purchased. (Look for a plaque adjacent to the Mission House and near a tree which marks the place where Rechner's house stood.)
7	An old heritage cottage (pug) believed to be the house GJ Rechner built for his parents.
9	The manse occupied by Dr JJ Stolz and Rec RB Reuther (sons of Pauline
5	The current manse.
10	Luhrs' Cottage (pug) - a heritage building. Luhrs taught at Immanuel Lutheran Primary school (11) prior to GJ Rechner's appointment
15	ALBERT SCHOLZ RESIDENCE: He married ELSIE RECHNER (1886—1969) He was the chemist at the Willows Hopsital.
